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NOTICE OF INTENT TO APPLY UPDATE: COMMISSION RECEIVES FOUR NOTICES OF INTENT FOR NEW CHARTER SCHOOLS

Commission provides an update on first step in application process

The Washington State Charter School Commission (the Commission) has received a total of four (4) Notices of Intent (NOI) to apply from four (4) organizations. The organizations represent a broad swath of Washington State communities, and intend to submit applications for schools in the following communities: (Proposed School Name, Grades to be served, and community served)

- Academy of Empowerment, Kindergarten through 8th, Federal Way
- Ashe Preparatory Academy, Kindergarten through 8th, Skyway/Seattle
- Fursan School, K through 12th, Bellevue
- Intergenerational High School, 9th through 12th, Bellingham/Ferndale

Charter School Commission Executive Director Joshua Halsey is excited about what these notices mean for the charter school sector. “This round of NOI is impressive for a number of reasons. Collectively, they represent the opportunity to serve kids in three new communities, and at each point along the K-12 spectrum. That’s great news for kids.”
