CHARTER SCHOOL COMMISSION RELEASES RECOMMENDATION REPORTS

The Washington State Charter School Commission's evaluation team has completed evaluation recommendation reports for organizations who submitted applications to launch high-quality charter public schools to open in the 2020-2021 school year. The Commission will vote whether to approve applications to launch charter public schools at the May 30, 2019 meeting at TAF Bethaday Community Learning Center in White Center.

Four organizations submitted applications this year: Catalyst: Bremerton (K-8 in Bremerton), Cascade: Midway (9-12 in Kent/Federal Way), Whatcom Intergenerational High School (9-12 in Bellingham/Ferndale) and Impact | Salish Sea Elementary (K-5 in Seattle).

The recommendation report summarizes the materials that organizations submit articulating several key elements of the proposed new school, including (but not limited to):

- Educational program design and capacity;
- Operations plan and capacity; and
- Financial plan and capacity.

The evaluation team consists of five evaluators with backgrounds in education or charter schools; their biographies are also included in the evaluation. Click here to view this year's recommendation report and summary.

"This year we received four applications, an indication that communities throughout Washington are interested in having additional high-quality public-school options for their students to attend," said Joshua Halsey, Executive Director for the Charter School Commission. "The recommendation reports provide Commissioners and the public with important information about each application and indicate the extent to which each application met our rigorous and thorough criteria."

The public is welcome to attend the Commission meeting to witness discussion and the final authorization vote by the Commissioners.
